Endodontics vs Single-Tooth Implants

Frank C Setzer received his dental and doctoral degree from the Friedrich-Alexander-University Erlangen-Nuremberg, Germany in 1995 and 1998; and his Endodontic specialty certificate, MS in Oral Biology and DMD from the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, PA, USA in 2006, 2008, and 2010, respectively. He is currently an Assistant Professor of Endodontics at the University of Pennsylvania, serving as Predoctoral Director in Endodontics. His research interests are the clinical detection, prognosis and assessment of periradicular pathology, in particular apical periodontitis, utilizing CBCT imaging in Endodontics and endodontic microsurgery. Dr. Setzer is a dental faculty member of OKU, a member of the American Association of Endodontists AAE, and a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics ABE. In addition, he is Associate Editor for Journal of Endodontics and the European Endodontic Journal and serves on several others editorial review boards.

Lecture description:

Many practitioners face the decision of when to treat a tooth endodontically or when to extract it and place an implant. This lecture discusses the new role of endodontics in an era that is more and more shaped by implant supported dentistry. It reviews changes in the treatment spectrum for endodontists and general dentists and provides evidence-based data for a sound decision making between a natural tooth and a dental implant. The lecture evaluates success versus survival of implants in single tooth and fixed partial denture restorations and endodontically treated and restored teeth.

1. Compare endodontic and implant studies according to success and survival rates.
2. Describe the importance of an interdisciplinary treatment planning approach.
3. Discuss whether to endodontically treat a tooth or extract and place an implant.
