# Bioceramic Technology in Endodontics and New Advances in Rotary File Design



**Anne Koch, DMD** is the founder and past director of the postdoctoral program in endodontics at the Harvard School of Dental Medicine. She currently maintains a faculty position at the University of Pennsylvania in the department of endodontics.

This course will re-affirm the intimate connection between quality endodontics and restorative dentistry. The instructor will trace the development of the bioceramic obturation technique along with an introduction to new rotary file design concepts. This will include the new 3-D cleaning techniques and their respective instruments. Attendees will learn the new design concepts in rotary file design meld perfectly with bioceramic obturation because we are now minimizing the size and shape of canal preparation.

- ♦ Describe fully the evolution of the bioceramic filling technique
- ♦ Discuss how new techniques were motivated by a desire to preserve tooth structure and to ultimately enhance the long-term prognosis of the tooth
- ♦ Understand the various surgical and pediatric applications of bioceramic technology
- ♦ Appreciate the performance differences in various rotary file designs
- ♦ Comprehend the methodology of the 3-D files
- ♦ Review the concept of anatomical shaping
